Our General Meetings are held at the Wailuku Community Center. The Beginners' Session will begin at 6:30 p.m. led by Andy Okada. He will be sharing his IDK and KISS methods of growing orchids. Although Andy has been growing orchids for only 3 years, he has consistently produced winners at shows, or have been selected a winner at our monthly Show & Tell table.

Our main speaker for the evening will be the renowned Tom Mirenda, who will be speaking on "Orchid Gardens: the 21st Century Conservation Tool".

hood and creating beauty with plants in botanic garden settings for more than half of his adult life. Educated as a Marine Biologist, Tom realized that he was better suited to Horticulture

and took positions at the New York Botanical Garden, Brooklyn Botanical Garden, and at the Incredible Greentree Estate in Long Island where he cared for a first class orchid collection. Eventually Tom accepted the Orchid Collection Specialist position at the Smithsonian Institution in Washington DC where he cultivated and curated a huge diverse orchid collection for 17 years. The collection was used to create massive 4 to 5 month long educational orchid exhibits displayed to literally millions of visitors each

For the past 13 years Tom has contributed 2 monthly columns for the ORCHIDS magazine, the Bulletin of the American Orchid Society, and has developed an international following as a writer, speaker, and advocate for orchid conservation around the world.

Having been involved at the Hawaii Tropical Botanical Garden on the Big Island, Tom found an orchid paradise where myriads of spectacular orchids of all types thrived by simply being planted in trees or placing them thoughtfully in the landscape. He believes that this is a viable worldwide model for orchid conservation. He also encourages the cultivation of orchids in garden settings by all the diverse stakeholders in the orchid community, as a way that orchids will survive the vicissitudes of climate change.
